



Conditions of Establishment

American Society of Highway Engineers – Old Dominion Section Scholarship

1. We establish the **American Society of Highway Engineers – Old Dominion Section Scholarship** through gifts to the John Tyler Community College Foundation, Inc. Gifts may be accepted from the American Society of Highway Engineers – Old Dominion Section or other interested entities at any time. The purpose of the scholarship fund is to assist deserving students at John Tyler Community College.
2. We direct the gifts be placed in the **American Society of Highway Engineers – Old Dominion Section Scholarship** with only the annual earnings or donations available for funding the scholarship.
3. Description of scholarship:


The American Society of Highway Engineers – Old Dominion Section Scholarship was developed to assist a student enrolled in the Engineering Degree program. The scholarship is to be used for tuition, books and fees.

4. Eligibility criteria include:
 - a. Completion of a scholarship application form.
 - b. Must have at least a 2.5 cumulative grade point average.
 - c. Must be enrolled as a full-time student at John Tyler Community College.
 - d. Must demonstrate financial need.
 - e. Must be enrolled in the Engineering (AS) Degree program.
 - f. Must have completed at least 30 credits toward degree.
 - g. Preference will be given to students who have received the scholarship in the past.
 - h. If, in any year, no applicants meet all of the above criteria, the student who most closely fits the above criteria will be chosen.

5. Requirements and conditions:

- a. There is no limit to the number of years a qualified student may apply for the scholarship.




