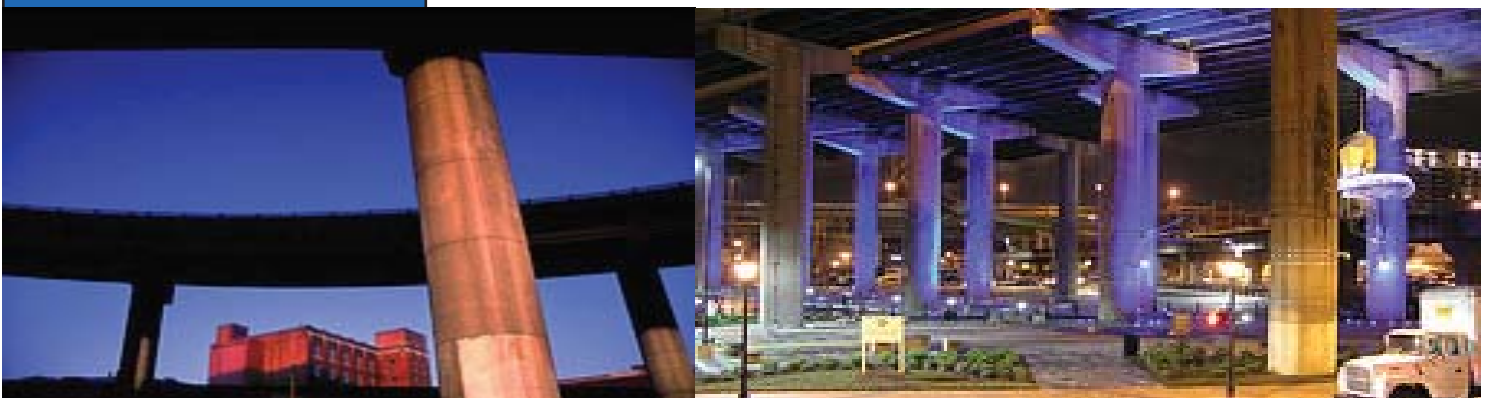

The Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) will be improving 11 existing bridge structures along the I-95 corridor through the City of Richmond and part of Henrico County. This project is approximately 7.13 miles in length and will rehabilitate bridges along the I-95 corridor at the following locations: Lombardy Street/CSX Rail Line, Overbrook Rd., Sherwood Ave., Robin Hood Rd., Hermitage Rd., I-95 over the Boulevard, Ramp A over the Boulevard, Westwood Ave., Laburnum Ave., Upham Brook Northbound and Upham Brook Southbound.
