The 3,000 foot Huguenot Memorial Bridge was originally built in 1949. It is considered a major transportation artery over the James River connecting Richmond city limits to the south and Henrico County to the north via Huguenot Road (Route 147). It carries more than 28,000 vehicles each day.

This \$45million VDOT reconstruction project will replace the bridge across the James River with a new structure that has two 12-foot lanes, two 10-foot shoulders and two 5-foot sidewalks. Based on the current development schedule, the project should be ready for construction by October 2010.
